

## Application to Auburn Montgomery School of Nursing

1. **Before applying to the School of Nursing:** Apply to Auburn University at Montgomery [www.aum.edu/admissions](http://www.aum.edu/admissions). Allow **at least four weeks** to complete this process.
  - ◆ Full admission to AUM and to the pre-nursing major are *required* to be eligible for application to the School of Nursing. Students on Academic Probation or Suspension and students with provisional university admission cannot be considered for admission to the Nursing program.
2. After full admission to Auburn Montgomery and to the pre-nursing major is achieved and most of the pre-nursing coursework is completed, submit the required ***separate*** application for the School of Nursing. There are two entry terms for Nursing – in the Fall and Spring semesters – and applications are available as outlined below.

3. ***Eligibility requirements for applying to the School of Nursing include (but are not limited to):***
  - ◆ Full admission to Auburn University at Montgomery and to the pre-nursing major
  - ◆ Submission of an official Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score (73 or higher preferred) to the School of Nursing by March 1<sup>st</sup> (OR submission of an official composite ACT of 23 or higher to the university Admissions Office by March 1<sup>st</sup>)
  - ◆ For Fall admission: No more than 22 hours of remaining pre-nursing coursework to complete over the two semesters prior to nursing entry
  - ◆ For Fall admission: Successful completion (grades of “C” or higher) of at least two (2) of the five (5) required lab science courses AND at least one (1) of the five (5) required lab science courses in progress at the time of application. *A student who has earned two (2) grades below a “C” in Anatomy and Physiology I or Anatomy and Physiology II is not eligible to declare or to remain in the pre-nursing major and is not eligible to apply to the upper division of the nursing program at AUM.*
  - ◆ For Spring admission: No more than 18 hours of remaining pre-nursing coursework to complete in the fall semester prior to nursing entry
  - ◆ For Spring admission: Successful completion (grades of “C” or higher) of at least three (3) of the five (5) required lab science courses at the time of application.
  - ◆ Successful completion (grades of “C” or above) of Anatomy and Physiology I and II within 5 years of nursing entry, or a retake of one is required
  - ◆ GPA based solely on pre-nursing coursework of at least 2.500 (unadjusted and without rounding) at the time of application
  - ◆ Successful completion of an interview with nursing faculty and local community leaders

#### 4. Please note:

- *To be eligible to apply for **Fall** admission students must have:*
  - Minimum 2.500 GPA (unadjusted and without rounding) based solely on pre-nursing coursework at the time of application
  - At least 2 of the 5 required lab sciences successfully completed (grades of “C” or higher) AND at least 1 of the 5 required lab science courses in progress at the time of application. (*A student who has earned two (2) grades below a “C” in Anatomy and Physiology I or Anatomy and Physiology II is not eligible to apply to the upper division of the nursing program*)
  - 22 or fewer hours to complete over the spring and summer semesters immediately prior to nursing entry
  - Completed and submitted a School of Nursing application by March 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Submitted an official Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score (73 or higher preferred) to the School of Nursing by March 1<sup>st</sup> (OR submitted an official composite ACT of 23 or higher to the university Admissions Office by March 1<sup>st</sup>)
  
- *To be eligible to apply for **Spring** admission students must have:*
  - Minimum 2.500 GPA (unadjusted and without rounding) based solely on pre-nursing coursework at the time of application
  - At least 3 of the 5 pre-nursing lab sciences successfully completed by the end of the previous summer semester. (*A student who has earned two (2) grades below a “C” in Anatomy and Physiology I or Anatomy and Physiology II is not eligible to apply to the upper division of the nursing program*)
  - 18 or fewer hours to complete over the fall semester immediately prior to nursing entry
  - Completed and submitted a School of Nursing application by October 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Submitted an official Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score (73 or higher preferred) to the School of Nursing by October 1<sup>st</sup> (OR submitted an official composite ACT of 23 or higher to the university Admissions Office by October 1<sup>st</sup>)
  
- Grades are counted each time a course is taken; grade adjustments (“forgiveness”) are not considered.
  
- All pre-nursing courses must be completed with grades of “C” or higher
  
- Students with a composite ACT score of 23 or higher on file in the AUM Admissions Office are not required to take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS).
  
- GPA is not rounded.
  
- Students are strongly encouraged to take the Anatomy and Physiology I and II courses at AUM within one year of Nursing entry and to keep the textbooks for these courses.
